

Along Highway 67 just south of Highway 50 the marquee at the Belfry Music Theatre announced an upcoming performance in a venue that had been dark since the 1990s.

New owners re-opened the theater in 2016 as a live music venue. The Belfry is a white building with a bell tower reminiscent of early day churches in the area. It was built in 1888 along Old Geneva Road west of Lake Geneva, east of Delavan and north of Williams Bay as a place of worship and meeting house for a Mormon community that had settled in the area. The group of about 50 members of the Church of the Latter Day Saints, was not well accepted in the community of mostly Lutherans and Catholics of European descent.

Before 1930, the church congregation moved out of the area.

"The Mormon group did not remain in the area but moved to Indiana and Illinois, then westward to Utah where they made their permanent home," said
Annie Trembly,
public relations
director for the Belfry Music
Theatre.

In 1930, the church was adapted for theatrical performances. A local theatrical production company called the Belfry Players leased the building in 1934 and began to produce original plays. The company was able to purchase it in 1938.

From prayers to performances

The first original play produced was titled "God's Laugh," Trembly said. Other sources list the 1934 productions as "The Youngest" and "Laff It Off." The theater increased its production to six shows each season. The summer stock players worked hard to produce fine entertainment for area audiences. The plays were performed back to back with a new production introduced every two weeks.

A tradition was begun with the first productions

that when the curtain was about to rise, one member of the audience was chosen to ring the bell that hung in the tower – a tradition that is still honored today.

In need of more space to accommodate the building of stage sets and storage for materials and costumes, a large shed was annexed to the back of the little church. In 1941, the box office was added where tickets are still sold today.

The actors were a combination of local amateurs and stipend-receiving non-equity actors. The paid actors were required not only to learn their lines but to help design and build the sets for the production. Their days were spent building or painting while their evenings were spent performing.

Some famous names

Over the years, many actors appeared at the Belfry as part of the Belfry Players but a few are well known to most theater-goers. These include Paul Newman, Gary Burghoff and Harrison Ford.

Newman spent the summer of 1949 as part of the Belfry company during the time actors built sets all day and performed in the evening. They had to remember their lines for the current play and learn their lines for the next play at the same time. Newman, is quoted in the book "Paul Newman: A Biography," written by Eric Lax as describing his time at the Belfry as "The only thing you do in such a short time to prepare, is to develop your bad mannerisms, or discover possibly successful mannerisms, but mannerisms nevertheless. Sure, what can you do in four days of rehearsal? You can hope to Christ that you can remember your lines, and that's about as far as it goes.'

In spite of this attitude, Newman spent the 1949 season involved in the Belfry Players before moving on to become a well-known Hollywood movie actor.


While some held Newman's view of the difficulty in becoming a good performer with the stress of working all day and performing in the evening, others felt the hard work was a valuable learning experience for young actors. And in spite of the difficulty, many young actors applied to be part of this summer acting troupe.

Another project looms

The Crane family, which owned adjoining property, donated a large hall to the Belfry Theatre that served as a dormitory for members of the resident company. The name was changed to the Belfry House.

"It is now in need of renovations." Trembly said. "A project that will be undertaken when funds for the renovation are obtained."

Burghoff joined the Belfry in 1962, a local boy who was not well known in theater. He too went on to become well known, but his fame was mostly on television where he played the character Radar on the popular weekly television show of the

1970s, "M*A*S*H," which depicted life in a medical unit during the Korean War. Gary's mother, Ann Burghoff, was also involved in theater, working as a writer and producer for the Belfry.

In 1964, another actor came to the Belfry who went on to become a major Hollywood movie actor known specifically for his continuing roles in "Indiana Jones" and "Star Wars." Ford, a 22-year-old Ripon College student, left school only a few months before graduation after being offered his first paid acting job, as a member of the Belfry Players.

Ford went through the same hard work as Newman had undergone 15 years prior, but Ford had the advantage of being more knowledgeable about construction, having worked in the field to finance his way through college. He was able to help design sets using his prior building knowledge.

Some of the plays that Ford appeared in that season included "Little Mary Sunshine," "Night of the Iguana," "Damn Yankees," "Dark Side of the Moon" and "Sunday in New York."

Entering a dark period

The late 1960s caused a disruption in the

Belfry's production schedule. A decision was made to widen the highway, which caused the historic 1888 building to be considered for demolition. The historic little theater was saved by moving it to Highway 67 just south of Highway 50 to its present location. Although the building was saved, the company underwent severe financial difficulties and ceased production from 1969 to 1976.

Barry E. Silverman, a director of the Dobama Theater Group of Cleveland, obtained proprietorship of the Belfry in 1976. He began a new operating troupe that became known as Dobama West. He remained at the Belfry producing shows until the end of the 1979 season.

From 1979 until the early 1990s, the theater remained mostly dark except for occasional performances and revivals. Showman Eddie Cash presented a series of local musical tributes in the '90s.

Then the theatre was put up for auction in 2013. Transformative Arts purchased the building and began work to restore the Belfry to a summer stock theatre.

"Renovations began with the purchase of the building to again restore the Belfry into a summer stock theatre," Trembly said. "We opened again in 2016 with a series of musical programs. We provided Dove ice cream bars and water to all the attendees at the end of the performance, because the theater was not air conditioned."

Air conditioning is being added now, she

"We also plan to continue to offer the Dove bars to our audiences," she said. "The early policy of choosing an audience member to ring the bell prior to the raising of the curtain will also continue."

Future plans

The new ownership has future plans for the Belfry.

"We are a passionate group with many plans for the future," Trembly said. "Our first

goal is to keep the doors open."

To do that, the group is working to encourage donations for the major improvements planned for the theatre. While restoring the active summer stock performances that have been a part of the history of the Belfry, the organization also has other plans for the building's use. It is working to have the building become a center where special events will take place. Business meetings, family reunions, birthday parties and weddings are some ideas for the use of the space.

"We already have a wedding scheduled for the fall," Trembly said.

The building has no running water, so anyone hosting an event at the facility would have to provide refreshments or

have them catered, she said.

For the upcoming season, the group is concentrating on music venues that are tribute bands to well known musical groups.

"Our season includes tributes to Simon and Garfunkel, the Eagles, ABBA, Neil Diamond, Frankie Valli and Fleetwood Mac to name a few," Trembly said. "Our tribute bands are all professional musicians coming from such areas as Nashville, Los Angeles, New York and Las Vegas."

The theatre is a somewhat small venue with a seat configuration that can be changed to accommodate the audience. The seats, which were donated by the Lakewood Community Church, are upholstered and comfortable. Ticket prices range from \$30 to



NEW OAKFIRE STAYS TRUE TO NEAPOLITAN STYLE

If you haven't walked along Wrigley Drive across from the Lake Geneva Public Beach lately, be prepared for an entirely new look on that street. The little house that used to be Scuttlebutts, then Oakfire, was torn down in January and replaced by a large contemporary style building that is now the home of the expanded Oakfire.

David Scotny purchased the former building in 2014 and after some remodeling reopened as Oakfire in May 2015.

"It gave us a chance to try out our new concept for the restaurant and evaluate whether our ideas would work before we closed again and tore the whole building down," said Scotny, who is also general manager of the restaurant. "Most businesses do not have the opportunity to have a tryout. After being in business for almost two years, we learned what would work and how to build a better mousetrap"

The rebuilding began with a teardown of the old building and, in spite of working through the winter, work progressed quickly, according to Scotny. The relatively mild

winter was certainly a factor in the successful construction. The new building is a contemporary structure that was built to incorporate the view and the feel of the lake.

A new pizza for the area

For Scotny, the desire to open a true Neapolitan style pizza restaurant became his passion.

"I wanted to produce a pizza that has been made the same way for over 300 years," he said. "I wanted to make a pizza that was made from scratch, cooked in a wood fire oven, using the freshest ingredients available."

Based his tryout in the former building, Scotny was pleased to see that his customers were as passionate about his pizza as he was.

While places to purchase pizza abound in Lake Geneva, the Neapolitan style pizza is a new concept to the area. When Oakfire introduced it to the community, it was not known if it would appeal to the residents and visitors to the area. But Scotny was not worried. He developed his business plan, moved his family to Lake Geneva and never looked back.

The interior of the building is open and contemporary. The restaurant also features three outdoor areas for patrons to enjoy the fresh air, sunshine and the magnificent waterfront view.

The restaurant has sidewalk tables with colorful umbrellas that line the edge of the walkway. The front deck adds a little more height to the view as people gather to enjoy a cocktail, lunch or dinner. Because of the second floor overhang this deck it is usually shady.

Indoors the air-conditioned seating attracts those looking for an escape on hot summer days. The main floor kitchen is open to view as Executive Chef Nick Crawford and his assistants prepare the made-to-order pizzas, fresh salads, and sandwiches as they are ordered.

.Authentic Italian ovens

The focal point is the large, red wood-burning oven that maintains a temperature of 800 degrees. When wood is added to the oven, there is no need to light it. It lights itself from the heat on the oven's floor. The pizzas are placed directly on the floor of the oven, no pizza pains or cooking stones.

The ovens – one on the first floor and another on the second – are imported from Italy. They add authenticity to the Neapolitan pizzas that are prepared just as they have been for

many years in Italy.

A full bar provides beer, wine, and cocktails of choice. At night this becomes the gathering place to meet with friends and enjoy a drink on the outdoor deck. The entire second floor becomes an outdoor venue as the floor-to-ceiling windows are raised much like an oversize garage door.

Most pizzas today are not made in the historic Neapolitan style. While many other pizzas use preformed crusts and canned tomatoes, the Neapolitan pizzas that have become the specialty at Oakfire are centered around a "simple is beautiful technique," according to Scotny.

.A meeting of minds

Chef Crawford met Scotny when he was still working in Chicago.


"David used to come into the restaurant," Crawford said. "I would often bring him his food and we would talk about cooking methods. I did not know at that time that he was opening a restaurant in Lake Geneva."

"We began to talk about his concept for a restaurant and he would invite

me up on my days off and we would discuss recipes and basically worked out the menu. Eventually he offered me the job of executive chef. So here I am."

Crawford and Scotny have the same thoughts about their fresh Neapolitan style pizza: that it has been made the same way for over 300 years and it isn't going to change now. Cooking in a woodburning oven gives the pizza a crisp, fresh flavor and can be cooked in as little as 90 seconds.

The reason for the two woodburning ovens at Oakfire – one on each floor – is to assure that the pizza gets to the customer fresh from the oven. If they were all cooked downstairs, by the time the server carried them up the stairs to the second floor they would have cooled. "Everything we use is fresh," Crawford said.

The dough is hand shaped as the pizza is being prepared. San Marzano tomatoes are used for the sauces. These tomatoes are the most famous of the plum tomatoes from Italy. They are grown in the rich volcanic soil at the base of Mt Vesuvius, giving them a sweet taste and low acidity. Their firm pulp, a deep, red color, and low seed count make them the favorite of many Italian cooks.

Buffalo mozzarella cheese is ordered from Italy and arrives weekly. It and mushrooms are among the favorite toppings for the pizzas.

"Anything with Buffalo mozzarella is popular," Crawford said.

Most people do not realize that it is a fresh cheese made from the milk of Indian/Asian water buffalo traditionally produced in Campania, Italy. In most dishes on the menu, the regular mozzarella can be upgraded to the buffalo mozzarella.

Variety is the slice of life

Service is very friendly as staff members move into their new roles. Much of the wait staff is new while a few of those who worked in the prior building have returned.

The menu, while not large, does feature a variety of pizzas. Traditional red sauce is offered along with white sauces. Flatbreads are also available.

Appetizers include calamari, eggplant, bruschetta and other Italian favorites. A variety of fresh salads and sandwiches are also



Wine, Dine and Nine

THERE'S MORE THAN ONE WAY TO PLAY GOLF AT HAWKS VIEW

ith the sun sparkling in the sky and the landscape in full color, for many the place to spend time is on the golf course.

Finding a course that meets the needs of a golfer who is looking for a

Finding a course that meets the needs of a golfer who is looking for a challenging course, yet one in which it is possible to achieve some success may be difficult to accomplish.


Hawk's View, 7737 Krueger Road, Lake Geneva, is an option that is just down the road.

Hawk's View has two courses. Como Crossing, a championship course, along with Barn Hollow, billed as a course anyone from a scratch player to a beginner "will have fun" on, according to the Hawk's View website. Barn Hallow is a par 3 course while Como Crossing is a par 72 course.

This course was opened in 2001 on the grounds of what had previously been a ski resort known as Mt. Fuji. Many of the ski hills are incorporated into the various holes, giving some interesting views and shots to golfers playing on Como Crossing. It is the only five-star rated golf course in Lake Geneva.

Barn Hollow, an 18-hole course, opened in 2003. This course was given its name because it stands in the hollow behind a barn that was located on the

property when Hawk's View acquired it.

While playing the course, the barn can be seen in the distance. This course is the only golf course in the Lake Geneva Area that welcomes families with children.

Both courses have won awards. "Golf Advisor in 2015 named Como Crossings the number-one course in Wisconsin based on customer reviews. Golf Advisor also named Barn Hollow the number-two short course in the United States," said Jake Bandi, an assistant golf professional at Hawk's

'Wine, Dine and Nine'

Hawk's View offers the traditional Friday fish fry, but with a twist.

Customers have the choice of golfing first or eating first according to the time they wish to do either activity in what is called "Wine, Dine and Nine," according to Bandi.

"Most people prefer to golf first as golfing after eating means golfing on a very full stomach," Bandi said.

"Wine, Dine and Nine is a new concept in the golfing world," Bandi added.

Hawk's View prepares the cod baked, fried, or beer battered and deep fried. Potato pancakes, corn fritters and coleslaw round out the meal. A glass of wine is included.

Golfers have a choice of playing either Como Crossing or Barn Hollow for the nine holes of golf. The price of the package is dependent on which course is chosen. The use of a cart is included in both packages. The Barn Hollow course costs is \$33 for Wine, Dine and Nine, while for Como Crossing there is a \$43 fee.

The fish fry is served from 3 to 9 p.m., so it is possible to get in nine holes before 3 p.m., or choose after 3 p.m. and have dinner with a spouse, significant other or casual friends.

Players may take their own clubs to the course, but clubs may be rented on site.

Night golf

An activity recently added at Hawk's View allows players to play some holes after sunset.

"We usually have about 50 players give or take a few, show up for this very different form of golf," Bandi said.

Hawk's View's night golf takes place on the last Friday of the month at 9 p.m. in May, June and July, at 8pm in August and 7:30 p.m. in September due to earlier sunsets.

"It is played in a scramble format with four-member teams," Bandi said.

A scramble format is when each member of the teams tees off, and then the team checks where each ball lands to determine who has the best position. The next shots are taken from those spots deemed the best by the

individual teams.

Because this is played in the dark, there are glow-in-the-dark tee markers and pins. Each player is issued one ball and a small flashlight. The ball also glows in the dark, but must be primed with a flashlight to emit a glow.

Barn Hollow is the course used because the flatness of the course is more conducive to walking at night. Carts on site do not have lights, so they are not used in the dark.

The fee for night golf is \$20 per player. This includes all green fees, one glow-in-the-dark ball and entry into the competition for prizes, many of which are more rounds of golf on Barn Hollow. Players have the choice of retaining their glowing balls or



In the winter, from Black Friday in November until the end of March, the golf simulator is set up in the pro shop. The golf simulator has 19 different golf courses programmed into it.

The Red Tail Ballroom can be tailored to fit large parties, including weddings, anniversaries, engagements, holidays or retirements. The ballroom can fit up to about 325 people. There is on-site catering that will provide meals and appetizers. There is also a bar. The Overlook Terrace, which has an open view of the courses in the background, is also available for wedding ceremonies.


Proceeds from the walk will allow the Garden Club to present grants to local service organizations and scholarships to students studying in horticulture related fields at either the technical college or university level.


